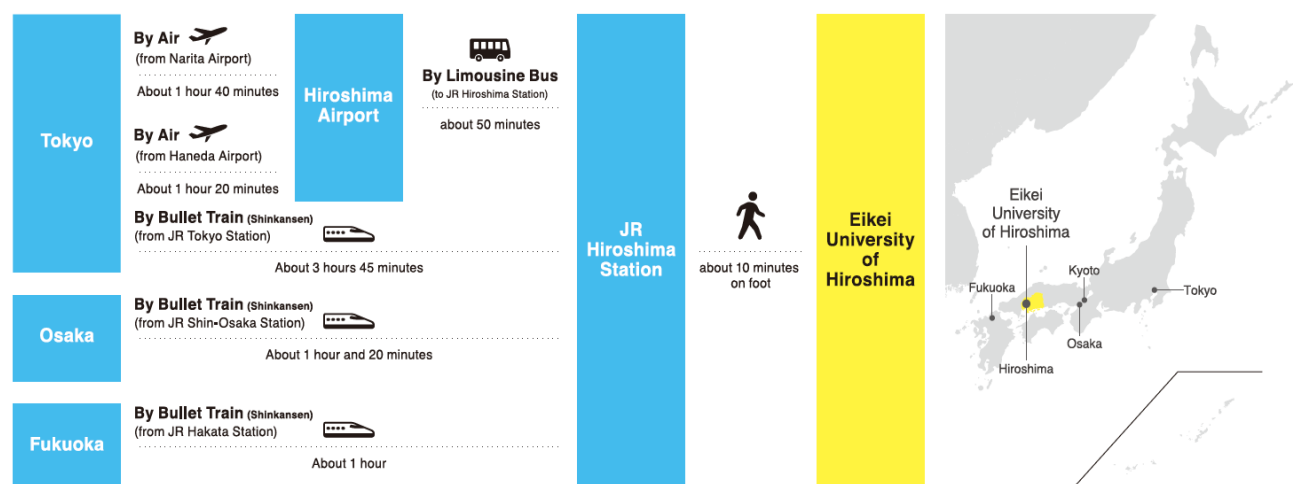

– Two World Heritage Sites in Hiroshima –



Itsukushima Shrine is one of the most significant shrines in Japan and the only shrine in the world built on top of the water. The view of Itsukushima Shrine has long been considered one of the three finest views in Japan.



The Atomic Bomb Dome is the most symbolic building in Hiroshima City, standing only meters away from the hypocenter of the atomic bomb blast. It has become a beacon for the world's prayers for peace and an end to nuclear weapons.

Core courses

Liberal arts courses categorized into Peace and Partnership out of the 5Ps are compulsory for all students.

Liberal arts subjects categorized into 3 perspectives (People, Prosperity, and Planet) are to be selected as electives in alignment with your interests.

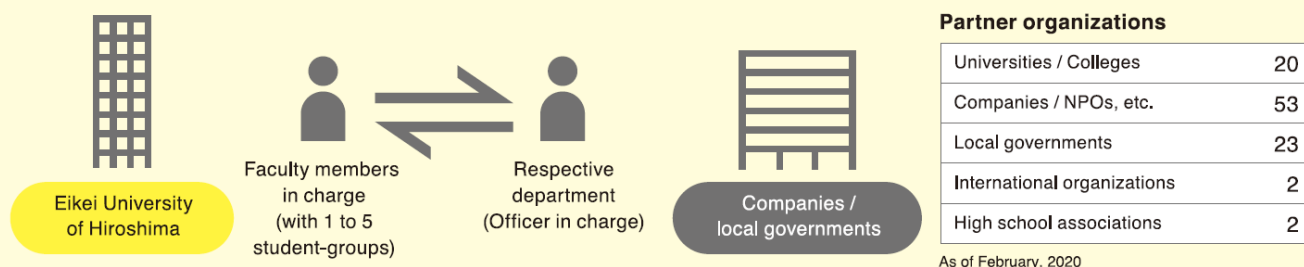
Project-Based Learning (PBL) to take on real social/corporate issues

PBL is a part of the curricula. "Introduction to Project-Based Learning" in the first year is compulsory for all students and it helps them to realize the knowledge and skills that they must acquire.

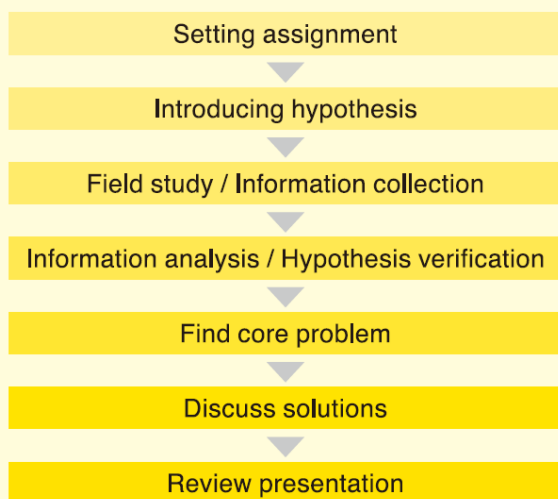
Students will take on PBL exercises several times in sophomore and junior years to discover factors causing certain social / corporate issues and propose solutions for them. It is designed for students to acquire abilities to discover and solve problems collaborating with others and to pursue tasks.

Platform linking various entities

A platform consisting of private companies, NPOs, international organizations, local governments, and the like is being established with all of Hiroshima coming together to actively incorporate real-world challenges into our education.

Example themes for PBL

Sample categories	Project themes
Private-sector companies (Food products)	Research on marketing environment to grasp consumer needs for overseas expansion
Private-sector companies (IT)	Crafting an idea for a new IT service
Private-sector companies (Transportation)	Service development for community planning through data analysis
Private-sector companies (Insurance)	Proposal for mitigating accidents caused by elderly drivers
Local governments	Inheritance of traditional culture in aging society with decreasing birth rate

Experiential / practical programs for visualizing students' potentials

There are a variety of domestic and international opportunities such as study abroad programs, internships, and volunteer programs in collaboration with partner organizations.

Students are required to participate in at least two program.

We have 23 overseas partner universities in 14 countries. (as of February, 2020)

Study abroad programs that require a fee are also available at 42 other universities in 7 countries.
